And as the summer winds down, there are exciting things in the works for fall. During August, the Nurture, Care & Fellowship Committee and I will be holding Inquirer's classes. It will also be an opportunity for us to see all of the different leaders and ministries that are at work at FCC and gain some skills for our work together.

But that won't be our only opportunity to gather as a congregation this fall. On September 22-24, we'll have an all-church retreat at Camp N-Sid-Sen on Lake Coeur D'Alene in Idaho. Camp N-Sid-Sen recently welcomed Rev. Dr. Pamela Peterson as its new director, and she is very excited to welcome us for a retreat! We're still finalizing participation costs, but it looks as though it will be around \$130-140 for adults and slightly less for children and youth. If cost is an obstacle, please speak with a member of NC&F or me (or if you'd like to help make it possible for someone else to attend). We'll have more details soon, but please save the date if you're interested in joining in!

Finally, members of the Missions and Social Concerns Committee and I have been reading an excellent book this summer, *The Land Is Not Empty: Following Jesus in Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery* by Sarah Augustine. Through stories and personal experiences, the authors discuss the long-lasting and harmful impact of the Doctrine of Discovery and Christian imperialism and challenges us to rethink our theology towards what gives life. There are plans in the works for a book study this fall. In the meantime, we invite you to grab a copy and join us in reading.

Moderator's Missive

Hello, FCC friends!

I hope the summer has been treating you well and that you have found time to enjoy the seasonal experiences that nourish you. I especially love waking up in the early mornings and being outdoors this time of year. This month's moderator's missive gets a bit detailed into the behind the scenes work to which so many of you contribute.

Rev. Ann-Marie had the wonderful idea of hosting a leadership retreat for members of all church committees on August 27 from right after church- around 11:30am to 1:30pm. This will take place in fellowship hall, with lunch provided. For a bit of context, church council meets monthly, and is comprised of the chairs of all the committees (that includes mission and social concerns; nominating; nurture, care and fellowship; outreach; stewardship; worship and one other committee, Christian education does not function presently), the clerk, the chair of trustees, the treasurer, moderator and minister. Each of the committees mostly meet monthly as well. We have worked on refining communication between council, trustees and committees, and my sense is that this is going well. Of course, having a full time minister is a big part of that, as she attends all the meetings. I am grateful for her authentic leadership style and good sense of what each committee does.

One of the purposes of this retreat will be for our committee members to review 2023 so far and create a budget request for 2024. We will also brainstorm how to describe our committee work in a narrative style budget that will be easy to present to the church as a whole during stewardship season, which gets underway publicly in September.

I am excited for this opportunity to spend time together, and hope it will be a fruitful experience of connectedness.
